Learn How to Identify and Respond to Human Trafficking

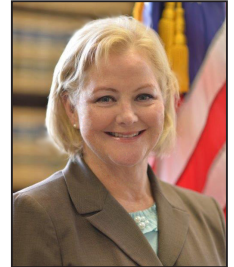

Nancy E. O'Malley is the District Attorney of Alameda County. She is a nationally recognized expert in interpersonal violence, including human exploitation and trafficking. She founded the HEAT (Human Exploitation and Trafficking) Unit in 2006 and has led the statewide charge in response to human trafficking. In 2010 she launched the HEAT Watch Program, which is a multi-disciplinary blueprint to unite prosecutors, police, service providers, and communities in the fight against human trafficking.
